P22A-OMCS/REV. 00	SURVEYOR APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPROVAL OF AN OMCS SURVEYOR

1. Studies

a. College degree as a Merchant Marine Officer, Mechanical Engineer or Naval Architect,

OR

b. Possession of a license which gives credit as Captain of vessels of more than 1,600 GRT or Chief Engineer of vessels with engines equal to or greater than 3,000 KW.

2. Maritime Related Experience

a. Experience on board vessels greater than 1,600 GRT as a deck officer or engineer with engines equal to or greater than 3,000 KW for a period of at least five (5) years,

OR

b. Work experience of at least five (5) years in a shipyard that handles vessels greater than 1,600 GRT,

OR

c. Documented Training as a technical vessel surveyor,

OR

d. Documented Former Flag State Inspector (Proof of appointment Required).

3. Documented Specific Survey Related Experience

a. Applicant must document at least 5 surveys within each scope. (Previous Survey Experience to be documented on Surveyor's Journal (P15) and ISM, ISPS and Approvals Audit Log (P16).

4. Documentation

a. Copy of college degree and/or copy of competence license.

b. Copies of Seaman book.

c. Copies Certificates for Courses related to the maritime industry.

d. Surveyor's Journal (P15) and ISM, ISPS and Approvals Audit Log (P16), properly filled.

e. Copy of letters of experience/employment applicable to point 2 above.

f. Passport size color photos, digital.

5. Approval

a. Approval is subject to review of the above documentation by the Technical Manager. Upon approval of the surveyor OMCS will issue an ID card and stamp.

b. Approvals are considered based on three (3) main areas, Studies, Maritime and Specific Survey related Experience. An Approved surveyor should fulfill all three requirements.

c. Surveyors that do not fulfill the requirement of specific survey related experience will be appointed as Junior Surveyors until further experience could be documented through the coaching of an OMCS approved surveyor.

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ABBREVIATIONS

After revision of the surveyor application, documentation, experience (Surveyor’s Journal-P15 and ISM, ISPS and Approvals Audit Log-P16) and documentation provided to OMCS. OMCS HO will authorize the appointed surveyor to do work in any and/or all of the following areas.
